A Christmas Gift for Nursing Excellence



Some husbands struggle with finding the perfect gift for their wives, but for Christmas 2007, Ted Jones knew exactly what he was going to get his wife Joy. He surprised her with creating a nursing scholarship in her honor at St. Jude Medical Center.

The philanthropy-funded Joy Jones Scholarship supports the pursuit and advancement of nursing education. This year, a record-number 22 nurses representing a range of hospital departments benefited from the Joneses' generosity.

A former nurse herself, Joy hopes to help nurses expand their skill set, acquire new knowledge and incorporate leading-edge procedures to foster optimal patient care.

"Motivating nurses to get additional education or certifications translates into improved quality of care," said Joy. "It's much more costly for nurses to get additional training these days compared to when I was a nurse. I want to help remove that financial barrier to pursuing more education."



Donor-supported scholarships play an integral part in St. Jude's designation as a Magnet® hospital, the highest accolade in nursing excellence earned by only 8% of hospitals nationwide.

On its journey to achieving this honor, in 2010 St. Jude set an ambitious goal in line with the latest recommendation issued by The Institute of Medicine—to increase the number of nurses with a bachelor of science in nursing (BSN) degree or higher from 55% to 80% by 2020.

Thanks to opportunities like the Joy Jones Scholarship, St. Jude has exceeded its goal ahead of schedule. As of last year, **84%** of its nurses have earned a BSN, MSN or doctorate degree; the national average for similar-sized Magnet hospitals is 65%.

Shawn Aguirre, RN, MSN, CMSRN, a 25-year St. Jude nurse and clinical educator for the medical-surgical unit, used her Joy Jones Scholarship to earn her certification in medical-surgical nursing.

A self-proclaimed "certification cheerleader," Shawn now coordinates on-site classes and study groups, and even lends out her course materials to help others pursue additional certification.

"Evidence shows that hospitals with higher certification rates have better patient outcomes. By getting certified, you become an expert in your area," said Shawn. "Nursing is not a stagnant profession. You constantly have to learn and seek out educational opportunities."

Sylvia Ochoa, BSN, RN, a clinical coordinator for emergency services, used her scholarship to cover classes and exam fees which allowed her to become certified in pediatric emergency nursing.

"I am so thankful for this scholarship. Having this specialty certification not only builds my confidence, but it also builds confidence in parents to know their child is going to get the best care possible," said Sylvia. "It has also made me a resource for other nurses who have less experience treating pediatric patients."

St. Jude is deeply grateful for the Joneses' philanthropic support of educational advancement, which is helping to foster the uplifting and healing environment that is so distinct to our hospital.

"The more you support lifelong learning, the better nurses you're going to have," said Shawn. "It's a sense of pride. Our staff is so proud to wear their certification pins. You just have a very happy, engaged workforce. It's a trickle-down effect which ultimately makes for the best patient experience possible."

A Hole-in-One for Breast Cancer

St. Jude's Annual Golf Classic reached a milestone this year as it celebrated its 40th anniversary at Los Coyotes Country Club on May 15. McCarty Breast Center: 3D mammography (or digital tomosynthesis).

This cutting-edge technology is shown to significantly increase breast cancer detection rates—giving patients the greatest chances for successful treatment and survival.

Welcome Dr. Eugene Kim

St. Jude Medical Center Chief Medical Officer

St. Jude Medical Center is proud to introduce Eugene Kim, MD, St. Jude Medical Center's new chief medical officer, responsible for oversight of all medical and clinical services at the hospital. Dr. Kim first came to St. Jude as hospitalist (in-patient physician), after 11 years with Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. He shares his thoughts on our hospital, his new role and the growing importance of philanthropy.



Q: What brought you to St. Jude Medical Center?

A: The first impression St. Jude had on me was how it was organized structurally. Even just looking at its facilities, it looked like an integrated care system.

But I really felt it was destiny that brought me to St. Jude. A lot of unexpected things happened in my personal and professional life that lead me to my first position here as a hospitalist. Along my journey, my father-in-law was diagnosed with leukemia. At first, I was taking him to Cedars-Sinai Medical Center because I was familiar with the hospital and physicians. However, I ended up transferring him to St. Jude and was amazed by the outstanding care he received at the Cancer Institute; he has been doing really well ever since. That further reaffirmed to me that this was the place for me to be, and it has felt right from the very beginning.

Q: What sets St. Jude apart from other hospitals? A: I love that St. Jude is advanced in several areas, and we have nearly all the specialties and technology here

to care for our patients.

At the same time, it has a great community feel. I continue to be impressed by the culture at St. Jude. Everyone has been so welcoming, and the fact that I was able to get acquainted with the staff so quickly that really stuck with me. Another thing I noticed quickly was the organizational values, especially with caring for the underserved. With all our patients, St. Jude invests in doing the right thing, even if it may not always have a monetary return on investment. The people that work here genuinely identify with that, and it gives them a lot of pride and passion. It's intangible. but it's crucial to the success of an organization.

Finally, I love our patients. More than in other areas I've worked, this community really seems to be appreciative of their hospital and the care they receive. They continue to be a highlight of my experience.

Q: What are your top priorities in your new role? A: I have a list of initiatives I want to tackle, but at the heart of it all is a focus on providing the most coordinated and seamless care possible for the patient. When my father-in-law, and at one point, my son, were in the hospital, my wife and I felt lost.

Even with my background in medicine, we were scared because it was just unfamiliar territory. I also felt firsthand how anxieties can rise if you're receiving different messages from different caregivers.

I've made it a priority to foster a multidisciplinary approach within our teams so that everyone's communicating and on the same page with a patient's care. I want to help build confidence and trust between the caregivers and patients, and within the care teams themselves. You can have the best physician in the world, but if there's no team, there's no support, and the delivery of care will still not be good. It has to be a team sport—and it has to be that way from the moment they enter the hospital to when they leave to when they continue their care outside the hospital.

Q: What is the importance of St. Jude's role given the current healthcare landscape?

A: I believe that we cannot wait for the government to have a good plan in place for us to follow. It will be on us as individual institutions and organizations to work within the set of rules we are given and find a better way. How do we impact healthcare on a broader level? It comes back to providing the best patient care and keeping people healthy, even beyond the walls of our hospital. It sounds like a simple task, but it's actually quite complex. We must continually evolve to serve our region, but we will only be successful through collaboration and support from others in the community.

Q: How will philanthropy impact St. Jude's future?

A: Philanthropy has helped us become who we are today and it will have a significant role in who we will be in the future. Health care is changing at such a rapid pace. If you're not at the forefront, advancing and leading, then you're already falling behind. I want St. Jude to be the gold standard across the spectrum—for us to be leaders and innovators. That level of excellence takes resources to achieve. especially today as hospitals are being asked to do more and more with less and less. That is why I am so appreciative of our donors. They truly are our partners in our unrelenting mission to provide extraordinary, life changing care.


